International Semester Courses (ISC) 24+ weeks

Discounted courses for students staying 24 weeks or more, who want to gain maximum contact with English language, life and culture.

International Semester Courses may include optional examination preparation for IELTS, TOEFL, FCE, CAE or CPE. ISC students may also choose to take optional afternoon lessons in English for Business, English for Tourism, or extra examination preparation, as available. These options are included in the fees for full-day IS courses, but are also available for students taking morning IS courses at a supplementary fee of £216 per 4 weeks.

NB Non-EEA students need a **General Student Visa (GSV)** for courses longer than 24 weeks, and must be at or above level CEFR B1 (Intermediate). All students complete a level placement test on arrival at St Giles, and any GSV students at a lower level will be obliged to return home. Tuition fees will be retained as a credit (but not refunded) for a new course of 22-24 weeks on a Student Visitor Visa, with any balance refunded after the deduction of non-refundable charges (if applicable): UK Visa Fee, Airport Transfer charges, Express Mail Fee, Accommodation cancellation charges.

Students requiring a visa for study in the USA must ensure that their visa is issued for the correct dates to include any breaks. Students requesting changes after arrival in arrangements for breaks must give 4 weeks' notice of changes, which are subject to availability. One change can be made free of charge, but for any subsequent change students must pay an Amendment Fee of US\$40.

Accommodation (all locations)

All accommodation charges must be paid direct to the College and all prices are per person per week unless stated otherwise. Accommodation is reserved from the evening on the Sunday before the course begins, until 10.00 on the Sunday at the end of the course, unless agreed otherwise.

NB. Dates are Saturday to Saturday at Phoenix Hall (Brighton) and Welkin Hall, (Eastbourne).

Cancellation or changes: Students in Residence Halls must give the office 14 days' notice of changes or cancellation, or pay up to 14 days in lieu. Students in all other accommodation must give the office 7 days' notice of changes or cancellation, or pay for 7 days in lieu. All changes/cancellations must be notified in time to take effect from a Sunday, and cannot be effected from midweek. For students in homestay accommodation at concessionary rates, standard rates will apply for stays of less than 24 weeks at the time of departure. Any balance of accommodation charges can be used for new accommodation, or can be refunded if the student is leaving the College. Students requesting changed accommodation arrangements must pay an Amendment Fee of £25 (UK), \$40 (USA), C\$50 (Canada).

Students must pay a retaining fee of 50% of the weekly charge if they leave their possessions in their room in homestay accommodation during absence on holiday.

Accommodation in Guest Houses or Hotels is best suited to students over the age of 18. Students under 18 must send the College evidence of parental consent if they request such accommodation. NB. In Canada the minimum age for renting a hotel room is 19.

Tuition fees insurance: Deposits and fees are not transferable from person to person. Students are advised to insure themselves against loss of fees through non-arrival, absence for any reason, or unexpected termination of their course. St Giles International can offer a competitive insurance package, which can be booked at the same time as the student's course.

The Colleges reserve the right to terminate without notice the course of any student who seriously or persistently misconducts himself/herself during his/her stay in the UK/USA/Canada.
